# Science says thinned forests are healthy forests

Overgrown forests are one of the key contributing factors in the current wildfire crisis in the west.

Another key factor is drought. Much of our forest lands and heavily forested private properties are experiencing serious wildfires as a result of these two factors.

There are still many properties within Sun Mountain Ranch Club that are heavily treed.

Over 30 of our neighbors have taken advantage of a generous program offered by the DNR to have their trees thinned. The DNR's Financial Assistance Program for Wildfire Resilience and Forest Health, formerly referred to as the cost-share program, focuses on technical and financial assistance to implement forest health or wildfire mitigation treatments or to help landowners write forest management plans.
